- Customer Service

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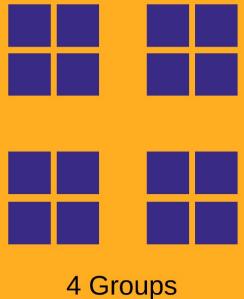
Challenge

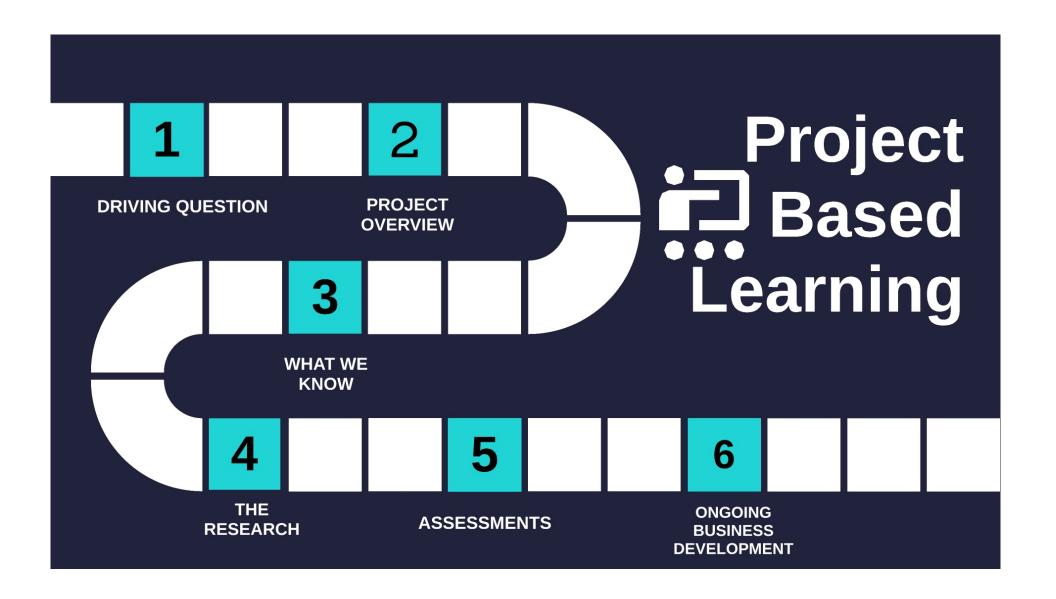
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OBJECTIVE

Students are build upon business skill learned from lectures and assignments in class. The skills will further be developed by starting a school based business. The overall goal will be to assess the principles of business learning the basic aspects of business including how to make a profit. The students will be responsible for mentoring the next group of students participating in the business venture. The students will have formative and summative assessments at the end of the semester. The skills to be development include: customer service, time management, business finance and assisting new students with business and soft skills acquired during this process.

Wash or detail cars during lunch. Minor maintenance oil or tire changes.

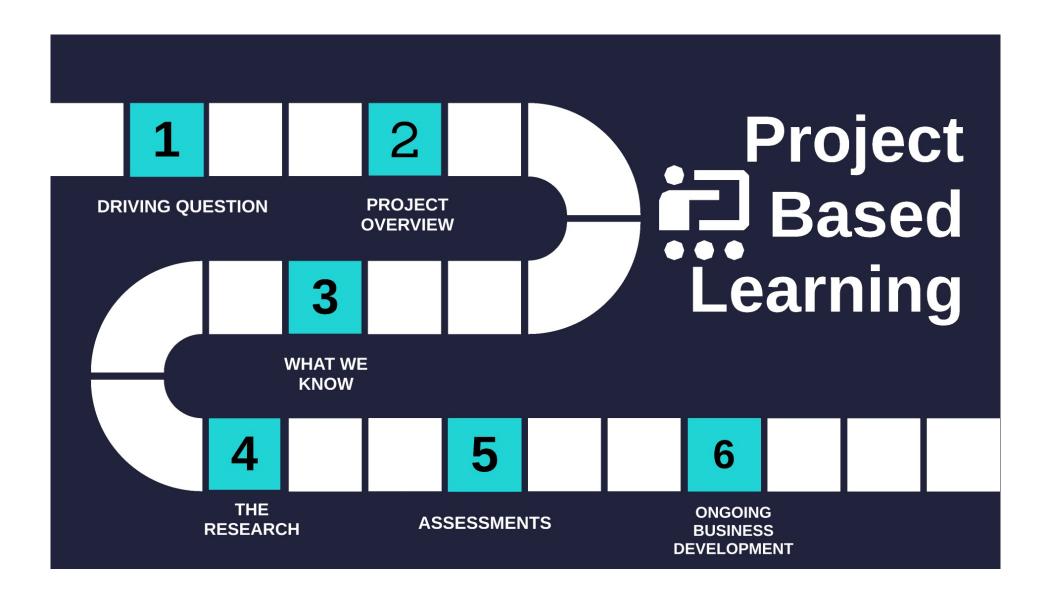

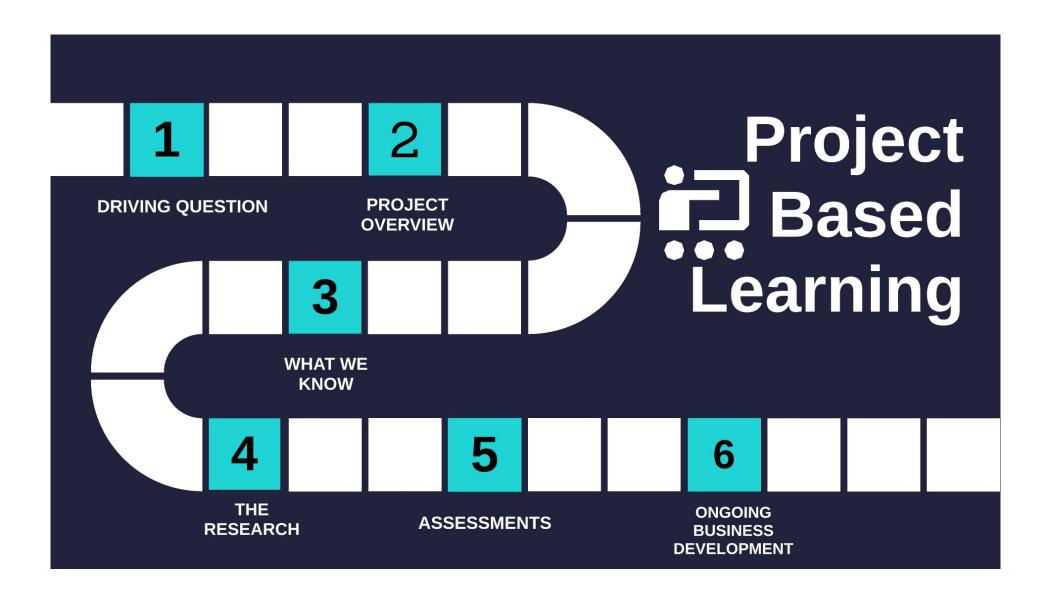
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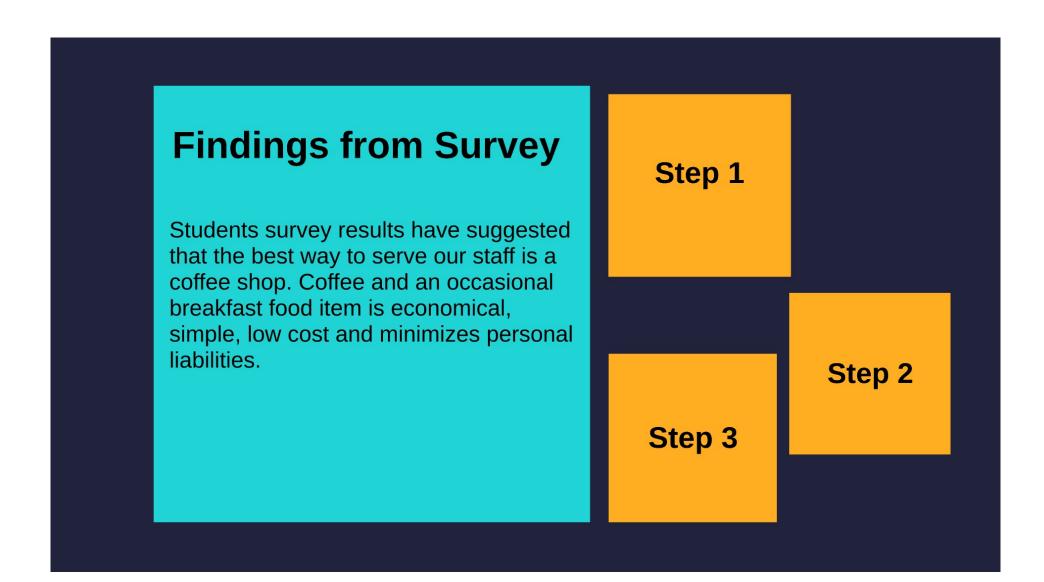


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The Business Start-Up

Students send out letters to local businesses for donations.

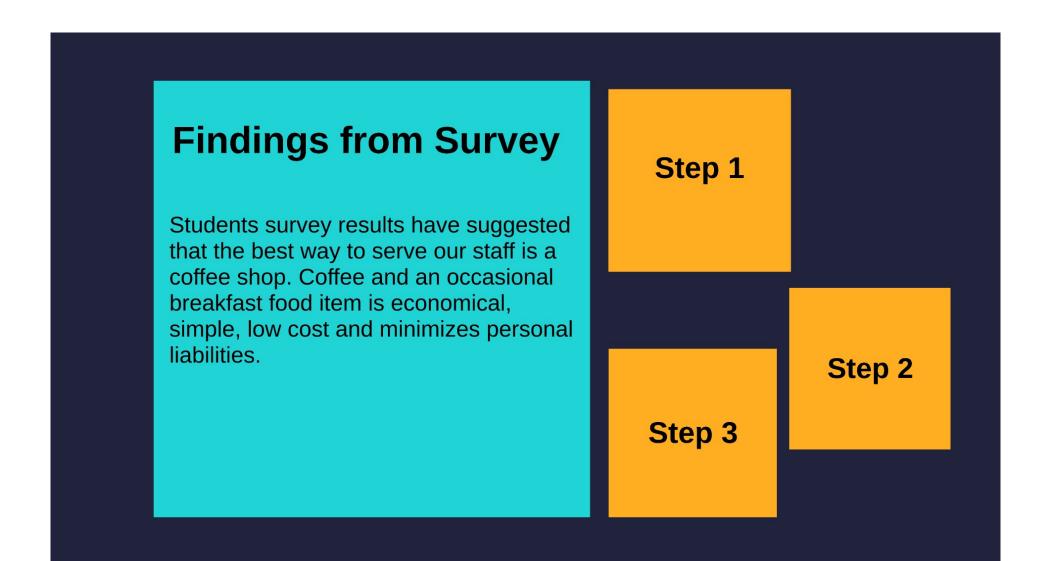
Students to determine lay out of coffee shop.

Students determine store hours, staff hours and daily cleaning schedules.

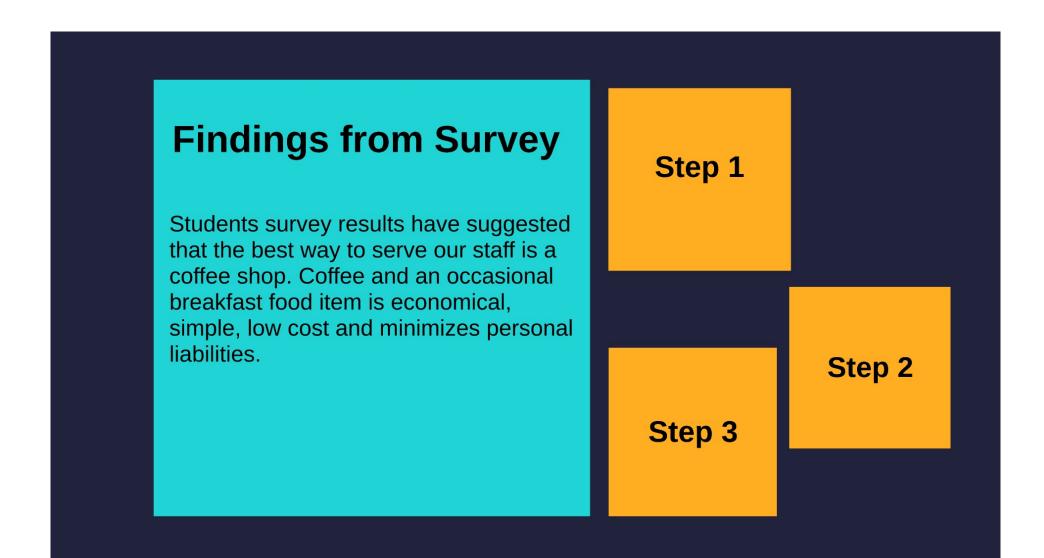
Students are to determine marketing strategies prior to grand opening.



Step 2



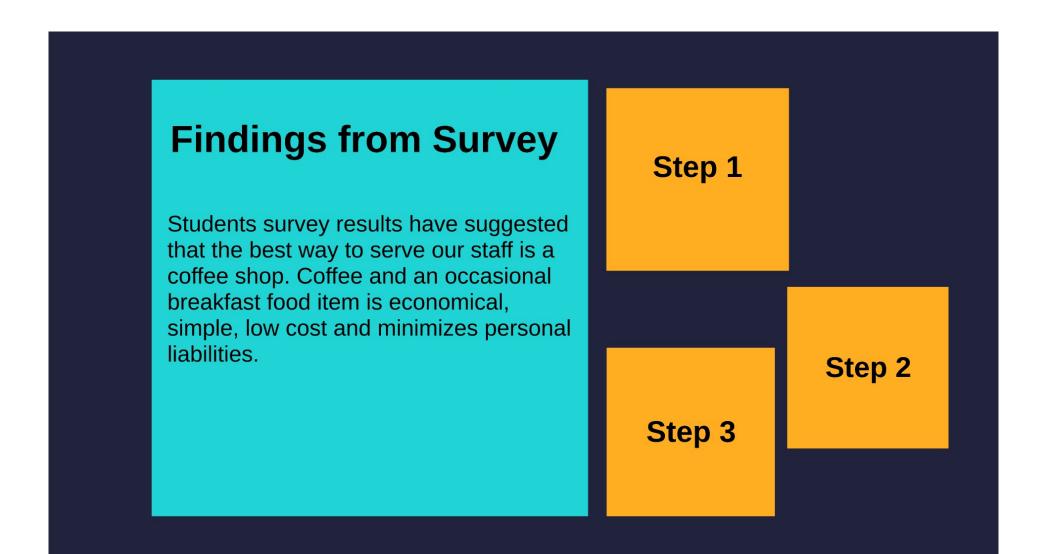
Students to monitor each other for peer reviews / evaluation during shop operation hours. Facilitator to offer encouragement and responsibility for student safety.

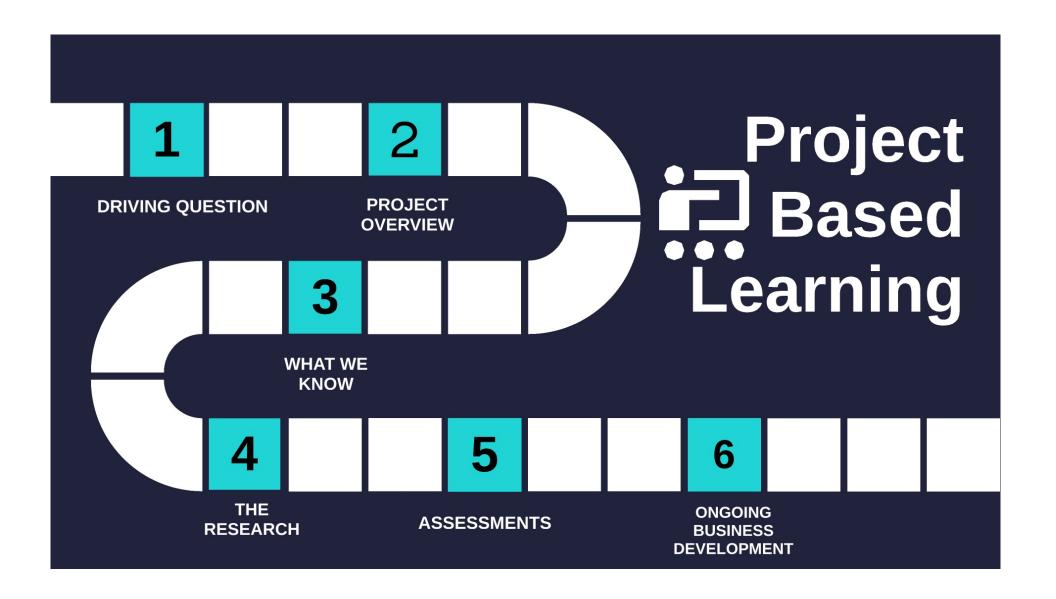


Step 3

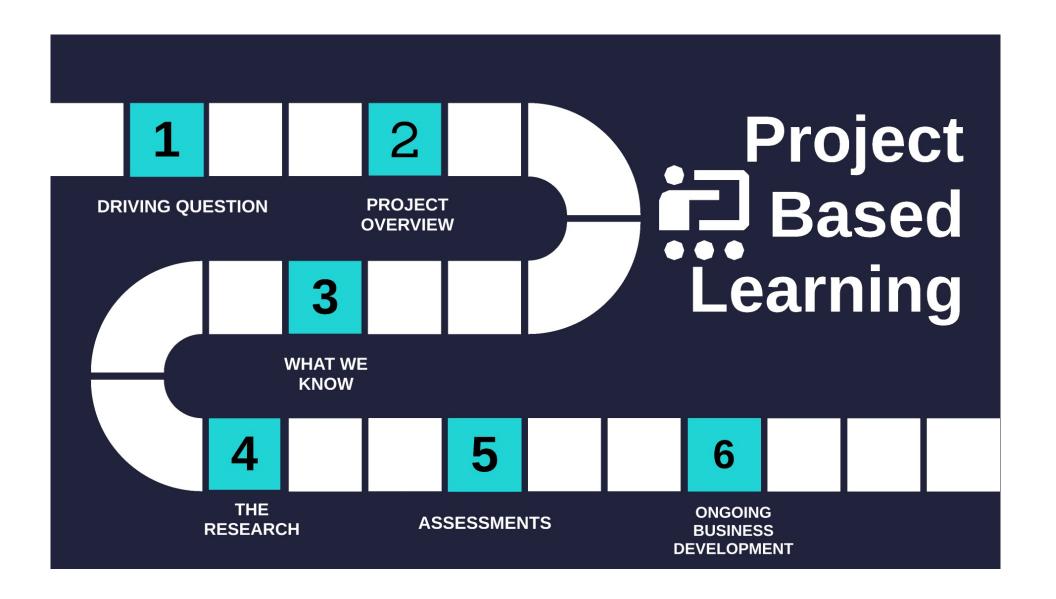
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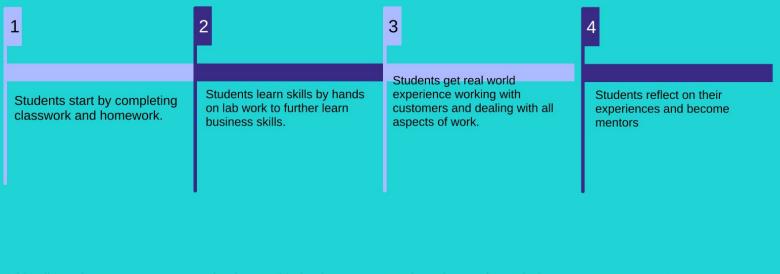


Ongoing Business Development

This project will be operated by the senior class students and those who excel in the business class. All remaining students will become mentors to new students during brainstorming breakout sessions in class. Mentors decide the topics to discuss from their journal that were experienced in the operation of the school based business. Graduating students also complete a resume to document their wealth of experience that can be used in a real world setting. The class will design a social media site with a discussion board to keep in touch with alumni as their skills are further development in the business world.



Goals / Teaching Business Skills



This allows them to get an understanding of the fundamentals of business.

A background in business fundamentals makes it easier for students to understand the start of their own business.

Students keep a journal of business activities which is formally assessed for a grade at the end of the semester. Skills learned help students advance beyond secondary school into the real world or college
